THE ART OF READING THE GREENS

Understanding the undulations and breaks of the putting surface can significantly improve your scores. Rolling Hills greens are particularly difficult to putt on as they are small, fast and have many subtle slopes. Try these simple steps prior to making your shot to increase success.

1. Assess the overall putting terrain.

Walk around the green. Take a good look at the surface from various angles. Look for slopes, ridges and valleys. The more you know about the surface the better.



2. Pay attention to the grass and its grain.

Depending on the grass type, look for the grain. This will vary in the shade. If the grass is darker, typically you are into the grain so slower putts are necessary. If it is lighter, the opposite is true. The grain tends to grow in the direction of drainage.



3. Plumb bobbing is a great way to determine hidden slopes.

up, ball & zippe

Stand roughly 15 feet from the ball so it is directly between you and the hole. Hold your putter at arm's length so it hangs vertically. Close your non-dominant eye. The ball will be hidden by the shaft. The putt will break in the direction the hole favors in relation to the club

New RHGC Competition Handicap



What is a competition handicap?

In an effort to ensure fair and equal competitions at RHGC, beginning May 5, 2024, the Handicap Committee and the Tournament Committee will review posted competition scores of all registered players and using the same formula as the World Handicap System (WHS) handicap index, calculate a RHGC Competition Handicap. The Handicap Committee and Tournament Committee will then assign the lower handicap between the WHS handicap index and the RHGC Competition Handicap for that competition.

Why does RHGC use a Competition Handicap?

Ensures Fair & Equitable Play

An RHGC Competition Handicap is calculated for each registered player of a competition and does not single out an individual player

Reflects Demonstrated Ability

An RHGC Competition Handicap helps ensure that a player's Handicap Index remains reflective of their ability and that equity is retained for all golfers

Complies with USGA/Texas Golf Association Rules

This is a common practice among golf clubs, as a player's Handicap Index should be responsive to scores that are inconsistent with their demonstrated ability

How is the Competition Handicap Calculated?



Calculation

Calculated same way as the World Handicap System Handicap Index



Scores Used

Uses only Competition Scores (not recreational + competition scores)



Assigned

The lower of the two handicaps will be assigned for the competition



Duration

Will be for current competition only and not impact WHS calculated handicap
