2025 MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL



A reminder has gone out on December 31st, around 7 am to those that have not renewed their membership for 2025. The email was sent to the Primary Member's email address registered with RHGC. These forms are prefilled with your membership information. If you have not received an email, please first check your spam/junk folder, then contact the RHGC Membership Director at RHGCMemberships@gmail.com with your membership number, to have them resent to you. NOTE: The ProShop does not have copies of your forms; please ensure you bring two copies with you for renewal.

Reminder: All 2024 memberships have expired as of December 31, 2024. Those who have not renewed will lose access to ForeTees until they've renewed for 2025. There will be no penalty for renewals processed between January 1st to 31st, 2025. Renewals processed February 1, 2025, or later will be subject to a 250SAR late fee.

Cart shed holders <u>must renew</u> by January 31, 2025. Failure to renew your membership will result in your cart shed being reassigned to the next member on the cart shed waiting list.















INTER-CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

In 2024, Golf Saudi launched an exciting new initiative aimed at increasing the visibility of golf in Saudi Arabia called the Inter-Club Championship (ICC). For the first season of the ICC, six Saudi Arabia based clubs were selected to come together to play against each other over a series of rounds. For each of the six rounds, SAGA fielded a team of 8 players, with a total of 22 golfers representing the team over the full season. Lead by the team captains, Fahad Al-Mulaik and David Bedford, and supported by SAGA representatives, Minhaj Khan and Jeff Meisner, the SAGA team won a staggering 75% of the total points on offer, blitzing the rest of the field (this included beating Dirab on their home course in the final round to seal the victory).

A huge thanks to all the golfers who supported the team, along with family and friends who came out to support the team during each round. The trophy is on display in the RHGC clubhouse, and we're looking forward to defending the title during the 2025 season, with more SAGA club members getting a chance to join the competition.





Many of our Members, and sections of the community will remember Hannah from early 2024 as an instructor in the Aramco Ladies Development Program, in association with Saudi Golf. Hannah will be with us from January 8 until March 2025 to help students develop skills, whatever their ability or experience.

Hannah is a PGA Advanced Professional Golfer, and Level 1 disability coach with ten (10) years' experience in training and development schemes, which encourage golfers from all cultures to learn and reap the mental health benefits that golf has to offer.

Originally from Neath in Wales, Hannah studied at Birmingham University and is one of the youngest golfers in the United Kingdom to have been awarded accreditation as a PGA Advanced Professional Golfer for her work, commitment and the development of female, junior and disability groups. Hannah is active with charities and specialist groups, and has been recognized for her advocacy for women in sport.

Hannah is qualified in coaching, custom fitting, Rules of Golf, Customer Service, Sports Science, First Aid, Safeguarding Children (Certified), Customer Service and Retail.

The Importance of Golf Bunkers Being Raked

Raking golf bunkers is crucial for fairness, course maintenance, and overall respect for the game. A well-raked bunker ensures that every player faces the same challenge, preventing footprints or club marks from giving unfair advantages. It helps maintain the quality of the course by keeping the sand loose and smooth, reducing the need for extensive maintenance. Properly raking bunkers also shows respect for fellow players and the game's etiquette, fostering a positive golfing experience.

Additionally, raking helps maintain a steady pace of play by making it easier for players to assess their shots without disruptions. It enhances the aesthetic appeal of the course, keeping the environment visually pleasing. In many clubs, raking is a standard rule of etiquette, promoting a shared sense of responsibility. Ultimately, raking bunkers is a small but essential action that contributes to fairness, respect, and the preservation of the course, benefiting all players.

Players should take a moment to identify the safest route to their ball, always using the lowest gradient as a point of entry. After the bunker is raked and level, leave the rake in the sand close to the edge for ease of access for the next player.
