VIP AND SPECIAL GROUPS

The regulations governing the use of Rolling Hills Golf Course are owned by Central Community Services Department (CCSD), please see the Recreation Manual for full details. On rare occasions, CCSD permits VIP's to play the course. Here is a quick reminder as to the policy and application process.

The RHGC Executive Board acts as quality assurance (QA) and reviewer for Member requests; once this process is complete, the application is sent to CCSD for consideration of approval.

A RHGC Member must sponsor the VIP by submitting the application form, and agree to play with that

person on the time and date specified. All forms must be submitted to CCSD no later than five (5) business days prior to the date the Member has applied to play. Please note the RHGC Board have full time jobs, and therefore, the QA and review process may take time, and is addition to the 5-day required by CCSD.....so plan ahead!

Applications must evidence the person is a VIP, as per the policy i.e. the person represents a registered vendor or supplier, and is an Executive (President, CEO, SNR VP, VP or CFO). Please note, the CCSD policy is not intended to include casual friends, relatives, or personal visitors.

BLACK TEES

As you are all aware, in advance of the 2024 Asian Invitational Tournament (AIT), three (3) new black tees were installed at the golf course, adding 85 yards to the golf course. This yardage added to the 147 yards that were added as a result of the two (2) black tees added in advance of the 2023 AIT brings the total yardage from the back sticks to 6,919 yards.

Below is a hole-by-hole breakdown of the additional yardage and the new total yardage from the new black tees.

Hannah is a PGA Advanced Professional Golfer, and Level 1 disability coach with ten (10) years' experience in training and development schemes, which encourage golfers from all cultures to learn and reap the mental health benefits that golf has to offer.

Originally from Neath in Wales, Hannah studied at Birmingham University and is one of the youngest golfers in the United Kingdom to have been awarded accreditation as a PGA Advanced Professional Golfer for her work, commitment and the development of female, junior and disability groups. TIPS/ETIQUETTE

The Importance of Fixing Pitch Marks


Ever wonder why a perfectly struck putt misses the hole?

An unrepaired pitch mark left for two hours will take up to two months (or longer) to recover. A pitch mark that is incorrectly repaired can take up to 4 weeks to effectively recover. A golfer will make 8 pitch marks during a round of golf.

Repairing a ball mark is quick and straightforward when done correctly.

- 1. Insert the ball mark repair tool just behind the mark.
- 2. Gently push the top of the tool toward the center of the mark.
- 3. Work your way around the mark, gradually pushing the surrounding turf inward toward the center.
- 4. Avoid lifting or twisting the tool, as this can harm the turf roots.
- 5. Once the turf is moved back into place, lightly press the area with your putter to smooth and firm the surface.

Following these steps helps maintain healthy turf and a smooth playing surface.



Please repair pitch marks and help us all hold more putts!
